Research opportunities at the University of Tokyo, Japan

As part of our internationalisation campaign, we have decided to launch a summer program, named the University of Tokyo Research Internship Program (UTRIP).

This program will start on June 24, 2010. It is a six-week research program for undergraduates who are currently enrolled in junior or senior year in a college or university outside of Japan majoring science or engineering. It offers them an opportunity to work on scientific research projects under the guidance of faculty members at the main campus of the School.

The purpose of the program is to motivate and prepare students who have a keen interest in pursuing an MD or PhD degree in the future. Students will attend a series of introductory lectures that cover the broad discipline of science in the morning, and spend the afternoon in individual labs or research groups. The participants that successfully complete the program will be awarded a certificate from the Graduate School. In addition, those

students who are highly rated by the faculty will be given priority for scholarship when and if they apply for the Graduate School of Science in the following year.

As financial supports, we will provide the participants with round-trip air tickets and full accommodation upon our careful examination to select students.

2011/12 Fulbright Awards – funding for postgraduate study and/or research in the US

Application deadline: 31st May 2010

The competition for UK Awards has now opened for postgraduate study in the USA.

- **All-disciplines Postgraduate Awards:** 12-16 awards are offered for first year of postgraduate or doctoral study or 'special student research' in any subject, at any accredited institution in the US. Award packages are for a minimum of \$25,000
- **MBA Award:** one award is offered for the first year of an MBA Programme at any accredited US institution (except Harvard Business School – see website for more information). Award is for \$25,000.
- **Alastair Cooke Award in Journalism:** one award is given to a scholar seeking a Master's in Journalism or in a specialist subject leading to a career in Journalism at any accredited US university. Award is for the first year of study and the award package is for a minimum of \$25,000
- **International Science and Technology Awards:** two awards are offered for PhD study at accredited US institutions in science or technology, at any US university. The award covers full tuition and associated fees for up to three years. Additional benefits include: a monthly stipend for up to 36 months; book, equipment, research and professional conference allowances, J-1 visa sponsorship for up to five years and round-trip airfare from home city to the host institution in the US (on a US airline).

Fulbright grants typically include a significant contribution towards first year tuition fees and maintenance as well as application support, application and entrance exam fees, limited sickness and accident benefit coverage, visa processing and cultural programming.
